In Memorium

Joyce Cummings Hobbs, JLM Past President, died of natural causes on Dec. 18, 2020 at her home in Montgomery, Ala. Joyce was born on Oct. 22, 1927 in Lake Forest, Ill. Mrs. Hobbs was preceded in death by her husband Truman McGill Hobbs and her son Dexter Cummings Hobbs. A graduate of Vassar College, President Hobbs moved to Montgomery in the the late 1940s with her husband, Judge Truman Hobbs.

The Hobbses shared a deep pride in Montgomery and desired to see it thrive. Once her three children reached school age, Joyce translated her interests into community service. She was an active member of the boards of the State Department of History and Archives, Montgomery Chorale, the Montgomery Symphony, Nature Conservancy, Goodwill, Children's Center and The Montgomery Academy.



She served as President of the Montgomery Junior League, Colonial Dames, Landmarks, Women of the Church of the Ascension, the Vestry of the Church of the Ascension and the Montgomery Zoo. Notably, though not surprisingly, both she and Judge Hobbs served as President of the United Way Board. Whether in her own home or in the home of a friend who is ill, Joyce was known for rolling up her sleeves and making good things happen. She didn't talk about doing things. She did them, and then without fanfare, moved on to her next meeting, to gardening or to making crosses for Palm Sunday. Her fierce love of family and her take-charge character have earned her the affectionate moniker, "The General."

Sympathy extended to **Past President Debbie Hobbs** (daughter-in-law), **Sustainers Emilie Hobbs Reid** (daughter) and **Nan Hobbs Barganier** (daughter-in-law).

Clare Bowman Cardinal, sustainer, passed away of natural causes on Jan. 4, 2021. Clare is the eldest sister to Past President Anne Bowman Upchurch and the late Harold Bowman Nicrosi, also a Past President. Sympathy is given to Sustainer Lang Cardinal, her daughter-in-law.

Myrtle Poundstone Ridolphi, sustainer, passed away on Jan. 8, 2021 of natural causes. Myrtle is preceded in death by many of her Poundstone cousins and nieces who were also members of JLM. Sympathy extended to the many active and sustainer Poundstone JLM members.
